⁸ COVID-19 IS HERE FOR THE LONG HAUL

The recent revelation that Hamilton mayoral candidate Bob Bratina has COVID-19 only reinforces the reality that the virus continues to be a problem.

Hamilton recently announced that people 18 years of age and older are eligible for a bivalent COVID-19 booster. Health officials are recommending that eligible people get a shot in anticipation of what could be a critical winter ahead. As of Sept. 22, almost 84 per cent of Hamiltonians have received a first dose of the vaccine, and 80 per cent have completed their primary series of vaccine

The reality is people are still dying because of CO-VID-19 even while high-profile decision-makers — including U.S. President Joe Biden — have declared the pandemic over.

The fear is that sentiment will encourage the public not to take the pandemic seriously and ignore getting booster shots.

Canada is doing its part to create a sense of "normalcy" by announcing that on Oct. 1 all COVID-19 border measures will be removed. That means travellers will no longer have to submit public health information through the ArriveCAN app, provide proof of vaccination, carry out COVID-19-related quarantine, undergo health checks for travel on air and rail, or wear mask on plans and trains.

No doubt as researchers learn more about COVID-19 and how it travels, protocols should change to reflect up-to-date safety measures.

For instance, airlines have eased off cleaning airplanes, but are still prioritizing air filtration because the virus spreads mainly through tiny airborne parti-

Although COVID-19 has been relegated to the back pages, the available evidence points to the continued risk COVID-19 poses to the community. Protection comes from receiving booster shots and reduces the risk for people in the community.

But the risk is lost with the passage of time when a new variant evades the immunity.

So a community's level of immunity remains in precarious balance.

For the most part, the so-called "end" of COVID-19 may look significantly different in a variety of geographic locations.

There will be a transition that will include a series of steps that will gradually normalize the facets of social and economic life.

With herd-immunity, population-wide public health measures can be phased out.

Are we there yet? For most governments, they are under pressure to eliminate those COVID-19 measures as the virus becomes endemic and doesn't disrupt everyday

But for those people who choose to ignore the continuing risks of COVID-19, the risks remain. There also remains continued transmission with an estimated 10 per cent to 30 per cent of individuals experiencing long COVID symptoms.

It would seem the virus will remain part of society for years to come, whether you want to believe it or not.
